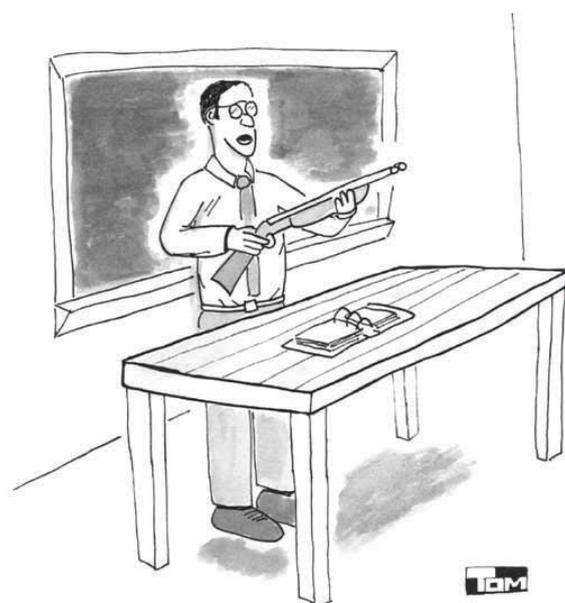

Faculty of 1000 to launch OA publishing programme, F1000 Research

Faculty of 1000 (F1000), the UK article evaluation services provider, has announced the launch later this year of F1000 Research, a new fully open access (OA) publishing programme across biology and medicine. The object of F1000 Research is to address the major issues afflicting scientific publishing today

§ timely dissemination of research, (it no longer makes sense to wait months or years to read, comment, or build upon another lab's work)

§ open post-publication peer review; open revisioning of work including ongoing updates peer review, and

§ sharing of data, excepting where there are privacy concerns, to enable re-use and ensure reproducibility.

It is intended that F1000 Research will work with the community to address all of these issues, and the initial platform will be a forum to do this. <http://f1000.com/>
