Localaw describes itself as "The most comprehensive and authoritative online legal research service in Local Government Law ... designed with the needs of the local government practitioner in mind."

It can be used on and off-campus however a user-

name and password is required:

username:portsmouthuni

password: welcome

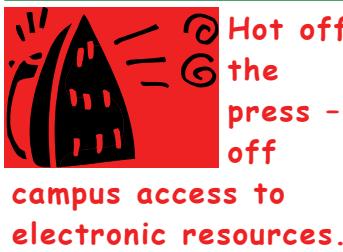

You can update your personal details after logging in. Sim-

ply click 'My Details' under the My Favourites tab on the menu bar.

The service is supported by **LocALERT**, providing weekly updates on the latest case law and legislative developments plus related articles on the latest local government issues.

Find it by searching for 'localaw' on the Subject Directory.

Anyone with a standalone computer is advised to set up webcache <http://www.port.ac.uk/library/webcache>. It gives access to most resources including Ebrary. **Info4education services** have a direct Username: uniport and Password: frewen. Mozilla Firefox is working with some (ie Shibboleth resources).

Departments in the Technology Faculty can now take advantage of a web form for each school or department to order book material for the Library. The form emails all the necessary details of the book to the Library and also to the Department's Library Liaison Officer for approval or record keeping.

Dr Jonathan Crellin, the Library Liaison Officer for the School of Computing has kindly extended the system his Department has been using successfully for some time now and hopefully this will speed up book orders fractionally. Eventually it is hoped to go to fully electronic book orders, but as yet we have no time frame for how long it will take our suppliers to make this possible.
