editions and multiple copies to see if reduction or repair work is needed. Please contact Andy, Timothy or Sue Stevenson if you have any queries.



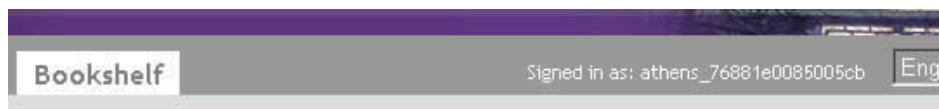
CIS Update

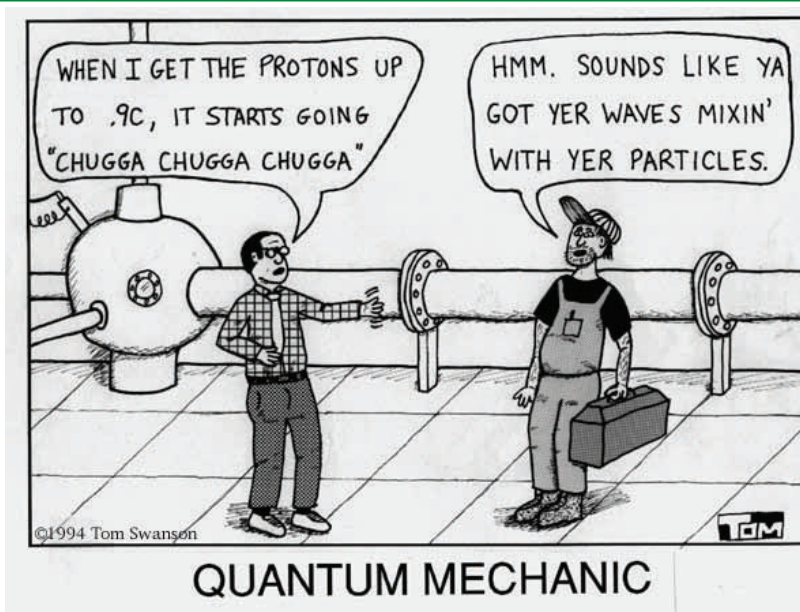
Ebrary - take action now to save your bookshelf!

Ebrary will be moving to Shibboleth authentication from 24th July. If you make use of the bookshelf you need to log in to Ebrary with your Athens account and make a note of your Athens identity as displayed below and keep it safe!
